
Why Join Citizens

Bridging to Citizens

- ☐ Announce those you'll be recognizing in your invitation to the event.
- ☐ Coordinate a speaker or two who can share some meaningful words about the members' participation and extend well wishes on the next leg of their journey with Best Buddies.
- ☐ Provide certificates to mark the occasion.
- ☐ Consider serving refreshments and providing some entertainment to make the party more festive.
- ☐ Add a meaningful activity like signing a card or t-shirt that can be gifted to the guest of honor.
